Download These Apps

If you've never owned or even driven an EV before, renting one can be a daunting experience. But it doesn't have to be. With the right preparation, you can jump into a Tesla, Polestar, Cupra or Kia EV with confidence.

Let's address the most common concern about renting an EV in Australia shall we?

Many Australians voice concerns over the availability of chargers throughout the country as well as the range capacity of EVs. We're here to tell you that many of these concerns stem from the early days of EV use and that the range of modern EVs AND the charging network have improved significantly.

At the time of writing, the national average cost of a litre of regular, unleaded petrol, is \$197.2. That's \$118.20 for a 60L tank! Now depending on how you choose to charge an EV and what company you charge with, you can get a full charge for anywhere between \$18 - \$40. If you're really lucky, you can even find chargers at no cost!

Right, so you're keen to rent an EV... We want to make sure you're armed with all you need to step into that car with confidence. So here are a few apps we'd recommend you top download first. If you're comfortable with your routes and know where you plan to charge, we'd also recommend setting up and activating the relevant charging apps prior to you picking up your car so when you arrive at a station, you can ensure a quick and easy experience.

Frequently Asked Questions

What if I run out of charge?

You won't! The technology in EVs to make them a seamless experience is truly amazing. Not only does the car tell you it's battery percentage just like your phone, it also estimates your remaining range based on the type of driving you are doing at the time.

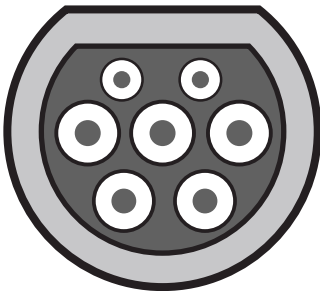
We supply all our EVs with a minimum of 80% charge. This is enough to get you around the city for a few days, it will get you between 300-500km depending on the vehicle you choose to rent. Also, if you return the vehicle with more than 20% battery we do not charge a refuel fee like our internal combustion engine vehicles.

How do I find a charger?

The Polestar, Tesla and MGZS have built-in maps which offer the option of highlighting the EV stations, charging speeds and availability on the map itself to help with finding a station. Otherwise, using your own navigation app you can search for charging stations (Google Maps, Waze etc.).

What charger do I use?



Type 2 (Mennekes)

Type 2 Chargers are used in Australia with all new EVs.

We supply all our EVs with a Type 2 charger, just in case your hotel or charging station does not supply one. With your rental you will also receive a DC plug for slow charging in a regular wall plug.
